Format your research as follows:

Forum: (ie. General Assembly First Committee)

Issue: (exact wording from the conference list)

Student Officer: (your name)

Position: (your title at the conference, ie., Deputy Chair)

Include research under the following sub-headings:

1. Introduction
2. Key Terms Defined
3. General Overview of the Topic / UN perspective
4. Major Parties Involved and Their Views
5. Timeline of Events
6. UN Involvement, Relevant Resolutions, Treaties and Events
7. Possible Solutions
8. Biography (to be comprehensive and MLA formatted)

Where and when appropriate include maps, graphs and charts, statistical tables, illustrations or photos.

Overall the report will run from 8-10 pages. Word processed format (not ppt).
